- 5 You will be trained to make airline reservations on our fully "live" Galileo computer reservation system.
- 6 Guest lecturers visit the college to talk to students about their specialty and students are taken on excursions to inspect a deluxe hotel, tour operator and the Indian Pacific train (all subject to availability at the time).

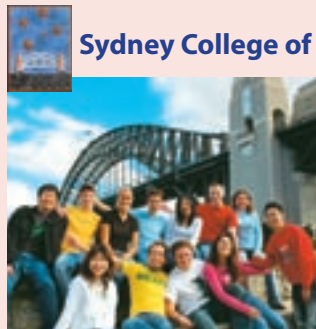
Access Language Centre

Work Experience

Work experience is arranged by the college on behalf of the students. This is unpaid for 2 weeks during weeks 21 and 22 of the Certificate course, and additionally for one day per week over 10 weeks during Diploma studies. Placement can be in a Travel Agency (retail or corporate), Tour Operator (outbound or inbound) and sometimes with an Airline.

Access Language Centre was founded in 1997 and is located one-minute's walk from Central Station. Students can study 3, 4 or 5 hours per day providing flexibility and choice for students who also want or need to work (Student Visa holders must do the 4 or 5 hour program only). Courses:
